POLICY ON CRITERIA FOR ENTERING FULL-TIME MINISTRY

Introduction

The ministerial body of the Open Bible Standard Churches of Trinidad and Tobago Inc. comprises individuals, some of whom are classified as full-time and others who may be regarded as part-time or bi-vocational. These classifications have been in existence from the very inception of the organization and no doubt will continue to exist in the future.

Over the years, a number of ministers have moved from being part-time (bi-vocational) ministers to full-time status. We regard such a move as both commendable and advisable. The transition however, has not always been smooth and there have been occasions when such a move has created financial and other problems for the church, the minister and his family and the organization. There have also been instances when the decision to become full-time was taken unilaterally with the National Board being informed only after the fact.

While it is true that the decision to enter full-time ministry is a personal and spiritual matter, we are of the view that such a decision can affect the effective functioning of the church and the minister's family, a measure of consultation and collaboration is therefore necessary. The purpose of this policy therefore is to provide a framework for a smooth transition from part-time to full-time ministry.

The following criteria now apply. Any minister with the organization deciding to move from part-time to full-time minister shall:

- (i) Be convinced that this is God's will for his/her life and the local church;
- (ii) Should show evidence of gifting for the particular area of ministry;
- (iii) Have the support of his/her spouse (if married);
- (iv) Give the National Board of Directors at least six (6) months written notice of his/her intention;
- (v) Have the approval of the National Board of Directors;
- (vi) Have the approval of the Local Board of Deacons and the membership of the church (except in the case of a pioneer work);
- (vii) Provide a plan for financial support in the ministry.
- N.B. The National Board of Directors stand willing and ready to assist ministers as they seek to fulfill God's will and purpose for their lives.
